Veneer captures the unique grain, figure, and character of a tree in a more sustainable and cost-effective way.

The process begins by selecting a high-quality hardwood log. Once harvested and conditioned the log is cut using one of several methods—rotary, plain, quarter, or rift cutting—each producing a distinct grain pattern. These veneer slices are then dried, trimmed, and skillfully matched to create consistent, decorative surfaces for furniture, paneling, cabinetry, and many architectural elements.
